DAY 1: CAPE TOWN

Arrive Cape Town and meet our representative outside the baggage hall for your private transfer to the hotel. Check in and rest of the day at leisure. DAY 2: TABLE MOUNTAIN, MALAY QUARTER, SIGNAL HILL, ROBBERN ISLAND & JEWEL WORKSHOP

After breakfast commence on a full day private of this wonderful city of Cape Town. The tour will start with a drive through the Malay Quarter and an explanation of its historic importance to South Africa before we reach the base of the Table Mountain. Visit the top by the rotating gondola, an exhilarating experience by itself. After descending this spectacular wonder of nature. We will stop briefly at Signal Hill to capture a bird's eye view of Cape Town. After a brief photo-stop we proceed towards the luxury neighbourhood of Hout Bay. We have a 2nd photo stop opportunity here before proceeding to V&A Waterfront for our 1pm ferry to Robben Island. After a 4-hour tour of this historic island prison where Nelson Mandela was held for many years, we return back to Cape Town. Your vehicle will drop you at The Jewel Africa workshop and showroom in the city. Browse through the sparkling wonders created by this organization. DAY 3: CAPE POINT, PENGUINS & SIMON'S TOWN

After breakfast take a scenic drive along the Atlantic Seaboard towards Cape Point & Cape Peninsula National Park and the historic Cape of Good Hope. Rugged rocks and sheer cliffs towering more than 200 metres above the sea and



cutting deep into the ocean provide a spectacular background for the Parks' rich bio-diversity. Cape Point falls within the southern section of Table Mountain National Park. The natural vegetation of the area, fynbos, comprises the smallest but richest of the world's six floral kingdoms. The scenic beauty of Cape Point is not its sole allure; it is also an international icon of great historical interest with many a visitor drawn to the area because of its rich maritime history.

The Flying Dutchman Funicular, also known as the Cape Point Funicular, is a funicular railway located at Cape Point. It is believed to be the only commercial funicular of its type in Africa, and takes its name from the local legend of the Flying Dutchman ghost ship.

The line runs from a lower station at the Cape Point car park, up an incline through dense fynbos to the upper lighthouse. The funicular leaves from the lower station every 3 minutes, comfortably accommodates 40 passengers per car, and can transport 450 persons to the upper lighthouse per hour, making it the ideal way to whisk closer to the lighthouse even during peak times.

Your next stop for the best penguin viewing experience, Foxy Beach is the place to be, just a short stroll from the actual Boulders Beach. The boardwalks are all wheelchair-friendly and will take you to within metres of the birds. There is also a visitor's centre accessed on foot using "Willis Walk" from the Bellevue Road/Cape Point side, or via Kleintuin Road from the Seaforth Road/Simon's Town side.

Boulders Beach has plenty of decent restaurant and cafés offering variety of food close to the gates (although nothing on offer inside the reserve precinct). A beautiful summer's day spent at Boulders is tough to beat, but don't get too close to the Penguins as they have a nasty nip on them. er the penguins we drive through the historic Simon's Town. The town officially called Simon's Town, but often referred to as Simonstown, was originally named Simon's Vlek after Simon van der Stel, the Dutch governor of the Cape Colony between 1677 and 1699, who surveyed the bay east of Cape Town in 1687 and earmarked it as a safe winter harbour during the months of May to September for which it was finally proclaimed in 1741. You can take phot stops at will before proceeding to Cape Town. Overnight in Cape Town.

WORLD WAR 2 VINTAGE MOTORBIKE SIDECAR TOUR

SHARK CAGE DIVING

So, you think you have what it takes to go Shark Cage Diving in Cape Town? You tell all your friends that you're one of the few people crazy enough to go swimming with sharks, don't you? Well if you are, then you've come to the right place, because you're in for a once-in-a-lifetime Great White Shark Adventure.

We welcome people visiting Cape Town with an appetite for adventure and a healthy dose of adrenalin running through their veins. You will have face-to-face encounters with lots of Great White Sharks and leave with a new admiration for the oceans most ferocious predator.

CANOPY TOUR

A zip line canopy tour in the company of soaring eagles, surrounded by breath-taking Cape fynbos panoramas and mountain-scapes only an hour's drive from Cape Town by car could well be exactly what you are looking for. Thrilled zipliners who have completed the course have described it as super safe. One commented that the quality of the structure and equipment was reassuringly high and had made her fear of heights irrelevant. Tour includes return transfers and a light lunch.



WINE, VINEYARDS & R62

Take a Garden Route tour. The first stop is the historic town of Stellenbosch.

Stellenbosch is a university town in South Africa's Western Cape province. It's surrounded by the vineyards of the Cape Winelands and the mountainous nature reserves of Jonkershoek and Simonsberg. The town's oak-shaded streets are lined with cafes, boutiques and art galleries. Cape Dutch architecture gives a sense of South Africa's Dutch colonial history, as do the Village Museum's period houses and gardens.



Reach the town centre by 0930am for a 10am walking tour with an expert local guide. After a 90-minute educating experience. Visit local vineyard to learn about wine making and tasting. Lunch at the vineyard or a local restaurant before commencing the drive back to cape town.
